Spring 2017 Workshops/Stanly County Partnership For Children

February 22nd ITS-SIDS 6:30-8:30 pm

Instructor: Melissa Jones, R.N., Child Care Health Consultant/Partnership For Children

Developed by the NC Healthy Start Foundation's ITS-SIDS Project, this session meets state requirements for ITS-SIDS training. Participants will learn to reduce the risk of SIDS through safe sleep practices for infants. Participants will also review Safe Sleep Policy guidelines, NC Division of Child Development and Early Education licensing rules, and maintenance of the proper forms. **(2.0 hrs./\$7.00) Counts toward the CCDF Requirement**

March 2nd Recognizing and Reporting Abuse and Neglect 6:30-8:30 pm

Instructors: Ashley Reid and Samelia Jones, Education Specialists with CCRI, Inc.

Do you know how to recognize and when to respond to instances of abuse and neglect? This session will help participants understand the NC Child Abuse Reporting Law, the steps required for reporting, common situations, and patterns for abuse and neglect after a report is made. **(2.0 hrs./\$15.00) Counts toward the CCDF Requirement**

March 9th What Every Baby Needs 6:30-8:30 pm

Everything in a baby's world happens in steps and stages. It is important to appreciate each stage as it occurs and provide the support and guidance needed to allow a successful journey through each one. This training will offer suggestions of what types of materials support learning at the different stages. You will gain insight on the benefits of providing babies with ample time and space to master a skill before moving on to start practicing a new one and will explore some of the drawbacks of intervening unnecessarily. With each mastered skill, babies are discovering more about their bodies, the world around them and how the two work together. These skills are the foundations that they will carry with the throughout their life and across all domains of learning. **(2.0 hrs. /\$7.00)**

March 23rd Developmentally Appropriate Behavior: But I'm Supposed to Act Like This! 6:30-8:30 pm

Instructor: Debbie Johnson, Healthy Social Behavior Specialist with CCRI, Inc.

Children use many different kinds of behavior as they grow and test their skills. Some of these behaviors, although appropriate for their developmental age, are still very challenging for teachers. This session focuses on understanding when children can be expected to acquire certain social-emotional skills and guides participants toward understanding, respecting and responding to developmentally appropriate behaviors. **(2.0 hrs./\$7.00)**

March 29th Medication Administration 6:30-8:30 pm

It is necessary to handle and administer medication to children in your care. During this training we will review what is considered medication, review NC child care rules regarding administering medication, which medications are required to be under lock and key, safe handling of medication, ADA requirements and best practices. **(2.0 hrs. /\$7.00) Counts toward the CCDF Requirement**

April 11th Darkness to Light's Stewards of Children Training 6:30-8:30 pm

Preventing child sexual abuse is an adult's responsibility. This training is an evidence-informed educational program designed to teach adults how to prevent, recognize and react responsibly to child sexual abuse. A documentary style video along with discussion and a workbook is incorporated in this class. Expected outcomes include changes in knowledge, attitudes and child protective behaviors. **(2.0 hrs./\$10.00 for cost of workbook for you to keep)**

April 27th PCAN: Prevent Child Abuse & Neglect: Building Collaborative Relationships with Families 6:30-8:30 pm

Early childhood and child care professionals build partnerships with families as an important strategy to promote healthy child development. These partnerships can help prevent abuse and neglect. Building effective relationships with families is the foundation for these partnerships. This training supports relationship building with families by helping providers to define and practice active listening skills and to understand both the concept of the parallel process in relationships and the importance of reflection. It will also aid participants in developing strategies for establishing effective relationships with families. **(2.0 hrs. / \$7.00)**

May 11th Creating Outdoor Learning Environments for Infants & Toddlers: It's Not Called a "Playground" Anymore 6:30-8:30 pm

Instructor: Priscilla Hayes, Infant-Toddler Specialist with CCRI, Inc.

"Going Outside" is not just about *what's* out there by *what you do* when you're out there! It's in the news almost weekly; America's children are not getting enough exercise. This training will help participants understand the benefits of taking children outside daily and provide suggestions on how to create spaces for infants and toddlers outside and introduce them to the natural environment. Finally, participants will be given ideas on what activities can be included in their outdoor spaces. This training provides information that supports ITERS-R subscales: Space & Furnishings, Personal Care Routines and Activities and Interactions. **(2.0 hrs./\$7.00)**

May 25th Causes of Misbehavior: Why Do They Act That Way? 6:30-8:30 pm

Instructor: Debbie Johnson, Healthy Social Behavior Specialist with CCRI, Inc.

Generally, children use negative behavior when they lack the skills that would help them meet their needs. Teachers who take time to assess the reason for misbehavior are better able to reach children new social-emotional skills. This session focuses on the common reasons that children misbehave, a crucial first step in determining how to prevent/reduce challenging behaviors. **(2.0 hrs/\$7.00)**
