This 4-hour introductory level training event is for early child care professionals who will be responsible for monthly playground inspections as required by NC Child Care Regulations. This session is designed to promote safe outdoor play areas for children in child care. Participants will learn about potential hazards on the playground and will gain hands-on experience by completing an actual playground safety check. \*Training will consist of 3 hours of classroom time and a 1 hour "field trip" (personal transport required) to a local park to complete a safety check. Biting is not "abnormal," but can be upsetting for teachers and parents and of course the "biter" and the "victim of the biter." You will learn about the different types of biters, strategies to use with each, and how to develop both an action plan and strategies for effective parent communication around this common behavior.
